It gives me a great pleasure to invite you all for XX Middle European Buiatrics Congress organized by Polish Association for Buiatrics. It will be held in Hotel Marina Club located in Siła near Olsztyn from May 17th to May 20th, 2020.

Lectures and posters will be presented on 18-20 of May, 2020. We also prepared an interesting social programme for accompanying persons, which will allow them visit the tourist attractions of Olsztyn.

Olsztyn is the capital of the Warmian-Masurian Voivodeship, founded as Allenstein in the 14th century. For centuries the city was an important centre of trade, crafts, science and administration in the Warmia region linking Warsaw with Königsberg. The most important sights of the city include the medieval Old Town and the Olsztyn Cathedral, which dates back more than 600 years. The picturesque market square is part of the European Route of Brick Gothic and the cathedral is regarded as one of the greatest monuments of Gothic architecture in Poland.

The aim of the Congress is to promote scientific discussions between researchers from different countries on the current scientific and practical aspects of veterinary medicine for ruminant health.

Call for abstracts

- **Abstracts should be submitted in English.**
- **All abstracts will undergo a peer-review.**
- Abstracts should not exceed 500 words;
- Microsoft Word 97-2003, Times New Roman font size 12, single-spaced, up to 1 page, A4 format, margins: left and right - 2.0 cm, top and bottom - 2.5 cm.
- Abstracts should contain **no** tables, figures, and references.
- Abstract should be as informative as possible, standard abbreviations may be used.

Specific requirements for writing sections of an abstract are provided below:

Title. Bold, upper case, font 14. Title should be short, clear and reflect the essence of the research.

Authors. Include: first initial and surname of the authors, e-mail of the corresponding author. Presenting author's name should be underlined.

Affiliations. List the institution, address, and country of each author.

Abstract body.

Background. Briefly describe the relevance and current state of the investigated problem, specify the purpose of the research.

Methods. Specify the experimental design, research and statistic methods.

Results. Summarize the most important results. All results must correspond to the methods described in the *Methods* section. We recommend that you include only data from the current study to this section and do not discuss literature here. Please provide clear indicators with assessment of variation, statistical significance, etc.

Conclusions. Clearly summarize and discuss key findings. All your statements must be supported by the results described above. Your conclusions should be related to *Background* section, aim of the study and/or hypothesis.

Keywords: Provide up to five keywords.
